Transfer students must have a minimum 2.75 cumulative GPA to be offered admission into Exercise Science.

Freshmen and Transfer Students - It is strongly recommended that students complete no more than 30 credits prior to transfer.

Students are responsible for curriculum requirements at the time of enrollment at SRU. Because curriculum may change from the point of beginning community college classes to enrolling at SRU, it is recommended that students occasionally consult an SRU transfer counselor.
