Students must have a C- or better in any POL course to be admitted directly to the Political Science program upon transferring to West Virginia University.

Students pursuing a degree in Political Science from West Virginia University may select an Area of Emphasis (AOE) as part of their course of study. Depending on the student's choice of Area of Emphasis, the number of AOE Courses required will vary as requirements may be met at Westmoreland County. Students who complete AOE requirements at WCCC can replace those listed in their final two years with general elective credit.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
