Program-Specific Information

SKW-101 Foundations of Writing I must be completed before enrolling in NU-412/413.

Students must possess a valid RN license before enrolling in any Nursing (NU) courses.

*The Philosophy requirement cannot be satisfied by PH-204 Intro to Logic or a transfer equivalent

Carlow University does not accept transfer credits from nursing schools or for nursing courses. However, students will receive a 30-credit block for earning their RN license.

Carlow University Transfer Criteria & Notes

Carlow University accepts credits for transfer if they meet the following minimum criteria:

- 1. Courses are at or above the 100 level and are not development or remedial in nature
- 2. Courses were completed with a letter grade on the A+ through F grading scale (No P, S, or other grades are accepted at Carlow University)

Carlow Covid Pandemic Exception: if P/S grade was earned during the Global Covid Pandemic and the granting institution has a policy indicating the P/S grade is equivalent to C or better, course can be accepted for transfer credit).

- 3. Courses were completed with a **minimum** grade of C or better (C- and below are not accepted)
- 4. A maximum of 90 total credits meeting the above criteria can be accepted for transfer to Carlow

Students enrolling at Carlow must complete a *minimum* of 30 credits at Carlow to achieve residency. They must also complete a *minimum* of 18 credits within their major at Carlow.

Course requirements, in special circumstances, may be waived or modified at the discretion of the faculty advisor and/or program chair.
