Students will need to select a regional and language concentration (15 hours) from Arabic, Chinese, French, or Spanish.

Students completing degrees from the WVU Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills.
