

Nursing Program - LPN to RN

Application Deadline: January 12 (day, fall start) or May 15 (evening, spring start)

NOTE: Students who complete the application and meet admission criteria before the deadline will be admitted to the program early. Students who complete the application and meet the admission criteria before the deadline, but after the program is full, will be placed on a waitlist. Waitlisted students receive a guaranteed seat when the next day or evening admission cycle opens (student's choice)

Thank you for your interest in Westmoreland County Community College's Nursing transition from LPN to RN program. This program has additional requirements beyond the Application for Admission to the college. Use the checklist below to ensure that you successfully complete all of the requirements to apply to the program.

- Age Requirement for health professions is to be 18 by June 1st (Fall start) or November 1st (Spring Start) of the year the application is due
- Become a Westmoreland student by applying at <https://apply.westmoreland.edu/>
- Submit an official transcript from your high school (or proof of GED) and from any other colleges attended. A final official transcript must be sent after graduation (high school) if accepted. *This includes a transcript from your LPN program.*
- Pay for, complete, and submit the National League of Nursing - Nursing Accelerated Challenge Exam (NLN-NACE) to Westmoreland County Community College before the application deadline. The exam assesses your ability to meet the demands of the Nursing Program and assesses your LPN skills in fundamental nursing. You will be evaluated based on the highest of up to two exam attempts submitted to the college per year. There is a 30-day required wait time between attempts.
- Obtain a Westmoreland County Community College student photo ID card

NOTE: completion of developmental courses may be required based on the results of the placement assessment. Developmental courses do not count in your Westmoreland GPA.

If you have 15 college-level credits with Westmoreland, attain a minimum GPA of 2.5 by the Program's application deadline

If you have less than 15 college-level credits with Westmoreland, attain any one of the following by the Program's application deadline:

- a minimum 2.5 GPA for a student who has earned 15 or more college-level credits at other post-secondary institutions (this GPA will be a composite score representing all institutions attended)
- a minimum 3.0 GPA from secondary school (high school). If accepted prior to high school graduation, your admission will be contingent on having a minimum 3.0 GPA on your final transcript after graduation.
- a minimum of 165 on the GED or a minimum of 15 on each subtest of HiSET.
